ultimately saves Chan Zhou from being sent to a detention
center, and her family's destiny is forever altered by Deng
Xiaoping's reform that allows her family to reunite in Hong
Kong, and subsequently emigrate to the United States. A
blend of *Wild Swans* and *The Red Scarf Girl*, *Flowing with*

the Pearl River is a vividly accurate portrayal of one family's painful experiences during Communism and the Cultural Revolution in China, and their eventual escape to freedom.
