This volume brings together a selection of papers proposed for the Proceedings of the 42nd Computer Applications and Quantitative Methods in Archaeology conference (CAA), hosted at Paris 1 Pantheon-Sorbonne University from 22nd to 25th April 2014. The present book includes a set of selected extended papers from the 4th International Conference on Simulation and Modeling Methodologies, Technologies and Applications (SIMULTECH 2014), held in Vienna, Austria, from 28 to 30 August 2014. The conference brought together researchers, engineers and practitioners interested in methodologies and applications of modeling and simulation. New and innovative solutions are reported in this book. SIMULTECH 2014 received 167 submissions, from 45 countries, in all continents. After a double blind paper review

performed by the Program Committee, 23% were accepted as full papers and thus selected for oral presentation. Additional papers were accepted as short papers and posters. A further selection was made after the Conference, based also on the assessment of presentation quality and audience interest, so that this book includes the extended and revised versions of the very best papers of SIMULTECH 2014. Commitment to high quality standards is a major concern of SIMULTECH that will be maintained in the next editions, considering not only the stringent paper acceptance ratios but also the quality of the program committee, keynote lectures, participation level and logistics. This book constitutes the refereed proceedings of the 20th International Working Conference on Requirements Engineering: Foundation for Software Quality, REFSQ 2014, held in Essen, Germany, in April 2014. The 23 papers presented were carefully reviewed and selected from 89 submissions. The REFSQ conference is organised as a three-day symposium with two days devoted to scientific papers presentation with a one-day industry track in-between. Both the industry and scientific presentations concern a variety of topics, which shows the liveliness of the

requirements engineering domain. These topics are for instance: scalability in RE, communication issues, compliance with law and regulations, RE for self adaptive systems, requirements traceability, new sources of requirements, domain specific RE, Natural Language issues and of course games. 'Games for RE and RE for Games' was the special topic of REFSQ 2014. This is materialized by a plenary session at the conference, and by a keynote given by Catherine Rolland, a serious games expert and project manager at KTM Advance, a French company specialized in serious games. The capillary, holistic and result-oriented nature that portrays this scientific field has led to the imperative of expanding knowledge about the different approaches, methodologies and impacts in all kinds of organisations when strategic communication is applied. Therefore *Strategic Communication in Context: Theoretical Debates and Applied Research* assembles several studies and essays by renowned authors who explore the topic from different angles, thus testing the elasticity of the concept. Moreover, this group of authors represents various schools of thought and geographies, making this book particularly rich and cross-disciplinary. This biography of the Roman Emperor Caracalla challenges his tyrannical reputation with a revealing narrative

of his social reforms and military campaigns. Caracalla has one of the worst reputations of any Roman Emperor. Many ancient historians were very hostile, and the 18th century English historian Edward Gibbon even dubbed him the common enemy of mankind. Yet his reign was considered by at least one Roman author to be the apogee of the Roman Empire. He was guilty of many murders and massacres—including that of his own brother, ex-wife and daughter. Yet he instituted the Antonine Constitution, granting citizenship to all free men in the Empire. He was also popular with the army, improving their pay and cultivating the image of sharing their hardships. Historian Ilkka Syvanne explains how the biased ancient sources in combination with the stern looking statues of the emperor have created a distorted image of the man. He then reconstructs a chronology of Caracalla's reign, focusing on his military campaigns and reforms, to offer a balanced view of his legacy. Caracalla offers the first complete overview of the policies, events and conflicts he oversaw and explains how and why these contributed to the military crisis of the third century. The study explores the strategies used by Saudi males and females when expressing and responding to gratitude

within same and mixed-gender settings. There are few studies that discuss the relationship between gender and thanking in Saudi Arabia. Altalhi (2014) analyzed the ways Saudi females express gratitude in different situations, but doesn't address strategies used by Saudi males. Hariri (2016) examined thanking only in emails between students and staff in an academic context. This study aims to answer the following questions: 1- do males in Saudi Arabia use different strategies when thanking females or do they use the same strategies that they use with other males? 2- Do Saudi females use more strategies than Saudi males? 3- Which strategies are used most by both genders? The data for this was collected from naturally occurring settings through an academic Facebook group. This virtual community of practice includes both males and females who either have or are pursuing post-graduate studies. The group was established so that the Saudi faculty members can gather and share their experiences and answer each other's questions. It has more than 7000 members who come from different parts of Saudi Arabia. The group members work at state universities as faculty members and have relatively similar socioeconomic level since they



have the same occupation and their salaries are standardized by the government with only small differences from one university to another. The paper analyzes 200 tokens of thanking with respect to the gender of the interlocutors. The thanking acts are divided into four sections (male to male, male to female, female to male and female to female). The results showed variation in the number and type of strategy between Saudi males and females. Although it was hypothesized that Saudi females would employ more strategies per thanking event than Saudi males, the data in this study showed the opposite. Saudi males used 15% more strategies per thanking event than the Saudi females. CMC provides an unprecedented means and new tools for communication and the way thanking is expressed in CMC is somewhat different from how it is communicated in face-to-face interaction since. In the case of thanking, the study showed that the participants made use of the new options available to them, which include emoticons and the post-like function in Facebook. The participants in this study were not reluctant to use what the new technology has to offer. In fact, the most frequent strategy in this study was the post-like strategy, which is an

exclusive feature of CMC generally. On the other hand, the emoticon strategy was surprisingly not used as much by the participants in this group, which may be due to the lack of intimacy between the interlocutors and the general formal tone of the group. The innovative use of both strategies suggests that the quality and quantity of gratitude expression is not constant, rather it changes depending on the medium (e.g. post-like and emoticon strategies). As hypothesized, complimenting was shown to be the least used strategies in this study. It was suggested that the low imposition level of the favors asked and the lack of intimacy and social power differences between the interlocutors could be factors for the low frequency of this strategy. The category of benediction was found to be the second most frequently used category after thanking. The frequent use of this category along with its use as a single strategy show the deep influence of the Islamic religion on Saudi Arabic thanking. Expressing intimacy strategies were the second to last in terms of frequency, which is not surprising, since these types of strategies indicate lack of social distance between the interlocutors. The data in this study showed a lack of the title strategy use and a low rate of use

for the honorific 2nd pl. strategy. This was mostly caused by the fact that the members in the Facebook group have equal social power. The most frequently used strategy in the address term category is addressing members with their names, although in the majority of cases, Saudi males and females chose not to use an address term altogether. The second part of the results and discussion section examined the response to thanking strategies. In the category of acceptance, the most used strategy was the post-like strategy, followed by the strategies text and emoticon. None of the subjects attempted to play down or deny the need for gratitude expression, perhaps because all of the requests were of low imposition, as well as due to the lack of close social distance between the interlocutors. No response was found to be the most common thanking response. Medium- and heavy-duty trucks, motor coaches, and transit buses - collectively, "medium- and heavy-duty vehicles", or MHDVs - are used in every sector of the economy. This third and final report focuses on a possible third phase of regulations to be promulgated by these agencies in the next decade. Yet, there is massive variance in the development of social investment strategies. *The World Politics of Social Investment: Welfare States in the 21st Century* is the first of two volumes of the World Politics of Social Investment (WOPSI) project, which systematically maps and explains different welfare reform strategies in democratic countries around the world. This volume develops a theory on the political and socio-economic conditions for the development of social investment policies around the globe, and studies the impact of the main explanatory



factors on the empirical variety of social investment reforms (and non-social investment reforms). It also proposes a new typology of different welfare reform strategies, distinguishing nine types of social investment strategies depending on their functions (creating, mobilizing and preserving human skill and capabilities) and their distributive profiles (inclusive, stratified or targeted), and three types of non-social investment welfare strategies (market liberalism, social protectionism and basic income). The chapters of this volume are written by leading social policy scholars from different disciplines and countries, who apply the WOPSI global theoretical framework in a range of contexts and policy fields, shedding light on the scope conditions of social investment, as well as political demand- and supply-side drivers of social investment reforms. This volume on its own or in conjunction with the second volume is an invaluable resource on the state of modern welfare and social investment policies from around the globe. Holocaust Archaeologies: Approaches and Future Directions aims to move archaeological research concerning the Holocaust forward through a discussion of the variety of the political, social, ethical and

religious issues that surround investigations of this period and by considering how to address them. It considers the various reasons why archaeological investigations may take place and what issues will be brought to bear when fieldwork is suggested. Case examples are used throughout the book in order to contextualise prevalent themes and a variety of geographically and typologically diverse sites throughout Europe are discussed. The typologically , temporally and spatial diverse body of physical evidence pertaining to this period is presented and future possibilities for investigation of it are discussed. Finally, the volume concludes by discussing issues relating to the “re-presentation” of the Holocaust and the impact of this on commemoration, heritage management and education. This discussion is a timely one as we

enter an age without survivors and questions are raised about how to educate future generations about these events in their absence.
