With the population of inmates who live with a mental illness on the rise, this research study looks to document the current mental health training received by correctional officers for all fifty states, the District of Columbia, and the Federal Bureau of Prisons. Personnel of each Department of Corrections were contacted; 75% of states responded. Descriptive analysis was conducted on mental health courses and trainers. The mean length of mental health training was found to be eight hours. Comparison of mental health training to total correctional officer training found only 2% of training was comprised of mental health. Finally, implications of these findings are discussed.
